- Judges say Government **doesn't need** to ask governments of Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland to set off Article 50
- Labour, SNP and Lib Dems demand Article 50 bill has EU divorce plan detail and make clear there will be amendments
- Government wants simple, short, bill
